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The Rural Domestic Preparedness Consortium (RDPC) lives by the principle of preparing for the worst and training to be the best, recognizing our first responders as heroes who safeguard us daily. We acknowledge the unique challenges faced by Rural and Tribal emergency responders and are dedicated to offering them specialized training.

Since 2005, RDPC has trained nearly 127,000 emergency responders across small, rural, and Tribal communities in all 50 states and five U.S. territories. We're proud to report a significant increase in training completion rates, with 7,834 students finishing courses in 2023, up by 51% from 5,182 students in 2022. Our training delivery and completion rates are now almost back to what they were before the pandemic.

We're excited to continue our work with DHS/FEMA to provide no-cost, high-quality training nationwide and are grateful to our Consortium Members for their ongoing commitment and support to RDPC's mission.


